## **HOW IS IT FUNDED?**

- \$100 Million from NYS & \$2.6 billion from US Treasury
- \$20 Million earmarked for Westchester households at risk of eviction due to their inability to pay rent and utilities because of COVID-19

# WHAT IS COVERED UNDER ERAP?

ERAP funds may provide assistance with the following benefits:

up to 12 months of back rent accrued as of March 13, 2020.



up to 12 months of unpaid utility bills accrued as of March 13, 2020.



households may receive up to 3 months of additional prospective rent if they are paying 30 percent or more of their gross monthly income on rent.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Westchester County residents, regardless of immigration status, must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Experienced financial hardship due to COVID-19 on or after 3/13/2020
- ✓ Owes rent at their current residence due on or after 3/13/2020
- ✓ Is at risk of homelessness due to rental arrears owed on or after 3/13/2020
- ✓ Household gross income can be no more than 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) for household size (subject to change)

### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

- Applicants submit documents through NYS portal
- NYS will review applications and process payments to landlords and/or utility companies
- Westchester County will promote the program and making sure that county residents know where and how to apply and make assistance available
  - Local marketing effort
  - Funding and technical assistance to nonprofits
  - 4 DSS District Offices will also provide access to portals and may be able to assist with any rent owed from prior to 3/13/2020

#### ACT NOW - MORATORIUM ENDS 8/31!

- NYS application portal: <a href="mailto:nysrenthelp.otda.ny.gov">nysrenthelp.otda.ny.gov</a>
- Application contains several sections i.e. applicant info., hardship, additional household members, income, landlord information, etc.
- Applicants must be able to upload supporting documentation
  - ID for all members, proof of rental amounts, proof of address, proof of income, proof of gas or electricity bill
- Tenants and landlords need to work together to complete application
- 4-6 week time for review and response
