Pre-Fire Inspection Checklist

- At the time of inspection, please be sure to have the following available for review (if applicable):
 - Record of annual fire alarm system tests
 - Elevator inspection certificates
 - Record of 6 month inspection of kitchen hood AES systems
 - Record of 6 month cleaning of kitchen hoods
 - Record of annual fire sprinkler system inspections and tests
 - Record of annual standpipe system inspection- hose, etc.
 - o Record of testing and maintenance of emergency and standby power systems
 - Record of testing and maintenance of emergency generator
- You or your staff may also want to check the following prior to inspection
 - If the building has a Knox box, have copies of keys to any replaced locks available to secure.
 - The street address must be clearly marked, and visible from the public roadway.
 - Smoke alarms are installed and maintained.
 - Carbon monoxide alarms are installed and maintained.
 - Exterior fire department Siamese connections for standpipe & sprinkler systems are not obstructed, have proper signage, caps are in place and fittings are not rusted and swivel freely.
 - Exit doors open easily and close and latch from any position.
 - Interior fire & smoke doors are not propped open, open easily and automatically close and latch from any position.
 - Test & repair (if needed) exit signs & emergency lighting.
 - No storage in any means of egress (including hallways & stairways).
 - No combustible storage in mechanical, elevator control, boiler & electrical rooms.
 - Fire extinguishers are present as needed in common areas (at least every 75 ft. or 3000 SF).
 - Fire extinguishers are mounted, not obstructed and their tags show current annual inspection date.
 - Extension cords not in use, other than for temporary use.
 - Power strips have surge protection/circuit breaker, and are directly connected to receptacles (not extension cords).
 - Electrical circuit breaker panels properly labeled, junction boxes, and outlet boxes, shall be covered, and installation complete.
 - Storage in buildings shall be orderly and stacks stable.

This is only a basic list that contains items common to all occupancy types. This list is not intended to address all code requirements that may apply. A quick survey of these issues, in addition to keeping your buildings safe, will simplify & speed the inspection process.
