



**IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TICKET HOLDERS AND WAITLIST INDIVIDUALS FOR THE
MAY 18TH COMMUNITY MEETING WITH THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS! PLEASE READ.**

Dear Tickets Holders and Waitlist Individuals:

As of this past Saturday, May 14th **all FREE tickets** for the May 18th Community Meeting with the Army Corps of Engineers at the Emelin Theater **have been claimed** and a Waitlist is now in effect. If you are a ticket holder who cannot attend the May 18th Community Meeting, please cancel your ticket so that the next person on the Waitlist can attend. If you are on the Waitlist and a ticket becomes available by 12 noon tomorrow, you will be contacted with further instructions. If you are on the Waitlist and have not been contacted by 12 noon tomorrow, you can still come to the Emelin Theater and stand on the Waitlist line. **PLEASE NOTE** that a very limited number of seats may become available in the event a ticket holder does not show-up. However, we cannot guarantee this.

So that we can begin our Community Meeting promptly, **PLEASE PLAN TO ARRIVE AT THE EMELIN THEATER BY 6:30pm**. As explained below, arriving to the Emelin Theater early is very important.

Parking

Parking on the top tier of the "Hunter Lot" across from the Police Station on Prospect Avenue is FREE for this event. Additionally, St. Thomas Episcopal Church has kindly offered the use of their upper parking lot (**EXCEPT** parking spots 14-through-22) for the evening. Vehicles can access St. Thomas's upper parking lot via Mount Pleasant Avenue. After parking your vehicle, you can walk to the Emelin Theater via some stairs and a short walking path at the eastern end of St. Thomas's parking lot. Limited parking is also available in the small parking lot beneath the Emelin Theater as well as across the street from the Emelin on Library Lane. As parking is somewhat limited in this neighborhood, we encourage carpooling, walking, or bicycling to the Emelin Theater.

Lining-Up

When you arrive at the Emelin Theater, there will be two signs located on the sidewalk on Library Lane. If you are a Ticket Holder, please line up at the sign that says, "**Ticket Holder Line Begins Here**". The Ticket Holder line will go down the sidewalk of Library Lane towards Boston Post Road. If you are on the Waitlist, please line up at the sign that says, "**Waitlist Line Begins Here**". This line will go up the sidewalk of Library Lane towards Prospect Ave.

When you arrive and stand in line, someone will check your name against the Ticket Holder and Waitlist lists. After being checked-in, security personnel will begin (1) performing security checks as well as (2) checking for proof of full vaccination + ID. The Emelin Theater's COVID-19 Policy states that prior to admissions, **all attendees must present proof of full vaccination** (i.e., two courses of Moderna or Pfizer, or one course of Johnson & Johnson) completed at least 14 days prior to Wednesday, May 18. **Please make sure you have acceptable forms of proof as well as ID to show to the security personnel. This can be a copy or photograph of your vaccination card, Excelsior Pass or COVID Alert CT. If you cannot show an acceptable proof of vaccination + ID to the security personnel, you will not be allowed to enter the Emelin Theater. ALSO, ALL AUDIENCE MEMBERS IRRESPECTIVE OF AGE MUST WEAR MASKS, COVERING THE NOSE AND MOUTH, WHILE INSIDE THE THEATRE AND THROUGHOUT THE MEETING. If you do not have a mask, one will be provided to you.**

By following this process, we hope to have all ticket holders inside the Emelin Theater by 7:00pm. **If you are a ticket holder and you do not arrive by 7:05pm, please note that your seat will be given to the next person standing on the Waitlist.** This is why it is so important to arrive early for tomorrow's event.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we prepare for this important event in our community. Thank you.
