
#### Wintry Mix Interior & Heavy Rain, Strong Winds and Coastal Flooding City/Coast



New York, NY WEATHER FORECAST OFFICE

#### **OVERVIEW**

Strong low pressure will bring a wintry mix to the interior, and heavy rain, strong winds, and moderate coastal flooding tonight into Saturday morning.



Widespread Moderate Coastal Flooding for much of the coast with Sat morning high tide:

- Coastal Flood Warning 1 ½ to 2 ½ ft of water above ground in the most vulnerable coastal communities of all of LI, coastal CT, coastal Westchester and Bronx, and northern and southern Queens.
- Coastal Flood Advisory Up to 1 ½ ft of water above ground in the most vulnerable coastal communities of NY/NJ Harbor, including tidally affected Hackensack.
- Wintry Mix for far Interior portions of Lower Hud, SW CT, and NE NJ: 1 to 2"snow and sleet tonight into Sat AM, particularly for areas higher than 500 ft. A glaze of ice across far NW Orange County. This will result in hazardous travel tonight into Saturday morning.
  - Snowfall Rates: Up to ½"/hr possible between 11pm and 4am.
  - Snowfall Character: Wet and heavy
  - Temperatures: Lower 30s tonight into Sat AM, rising into the upper 30s Sat aft
- Heavy Rain for City/Coast: 1 to 1 1/2" of total rainfall likely. Locally 2" possible along the city/coast. Minor flooding of urban areas and along quick responding small rivers and streams likely. This could be exacerbated across shoreline and tidally affected riverine communities near the times of high tide Saturday morning.
  - Rainfall Rates: 1" in 3 hrs possible between 1am and 6am tonight for city/coast
- Peak Winds: Wind Advisory Easterly winds 20-30 with gusts to 50 mph for LI and SE CT midnight to 6am Sat. Gusts 35-45mph for the remainder of the city/coast. Isolated downed tree branches and powerlines possible.

Coastal Flood Warnings and Advisories for Sat AM high tide NWS ALERTS Wind Advisory Tonight

**Gale Warning Tonight into Sat AM** 

Isolated thunderstorms possible for the city/coast between 1am and 6am.

The magnitude of coastal flooding Sat AM will be determined by the timing of winds shifting from the east to the northeast in relation to the time of high tide Saturday morning. The forecast has been leaned towards a worst case scenario, but if timing of wind shift occurs earlier than forecast, then water level will fall below forecast.

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






### Most Likely Rainfall – Official Forecast






## Maximum Wind Gusts Tonight into Saturday
