Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting - April 6, 2022 via Zoom

Attendees: Tina Maresca, Karrie Sergio, Heather Castellani Milboer, Brittany Ross, Tim O'Connor

Present: Jason Pinto, Jeff Ahne, Nora Lucas

Guest Attendees: Luca Giobbio, Eli Tannenbaum and Griffin McIntyre

Opening:

Tina asked for a motion to open the meeting, Heather made a motion, Brittany seconded. Tina asked for a motion to approve the March minutes, Brittany made a motion, Heather seconded, all approved.

Presentation by Mamaroneck High School OCRA Students - Summer Slide Library in Papes Park:

We were joined by 3 students of MHS's Original Civic Research and Action program, a 4-year program focused on improving civic engagement among students. Juniors Luca Giobbio, Eli Tannenbaum and Griffin McIntyre gave a presentation on their Summer Slide Prevention Initiative. The summer slide is where students lose reading skill over the summer when they lose access to books that were provided by school, low-income kids are most susceptible. Their plan is to construct a freestanding book depot at the Pape Memorial Park for use during the summer months, provide a constant stream of new books to students living in the area; with a strong emphasis on 3rd-5th graders, conduct weekly group book talks to further engage students using the book depot, and work closely with MAS. The PRC members were all very impressed with the presentation and commended the boys for their hard work and efforts.

Capital Projects

Jefferson Avenue Park Playground Design Update:

Jeff said design and structure are the same, the only thing is the baby swings were drawn in and the two spots were connected. Tina asked about timing, Jeff said they were told from order about 8 months to get equipment in. Karrie asked about adding more benches and Brittany asked about more picnic tables. Jeff said the walkways are missing from the design so it's hard to tell but there's not really that much room and benches need to be a certain distance from playground equipment. Jeff will take some measurements to see what else they might be able to fit in without being intrusive. Tim asked about the flooring. Jeff said it will either be poured rubber or rubber tile, both have the same safety specs. Jason said the rubber tiles are easier to repair so they are weighing the options. Tim asked about life expectancy. Jeff said after the first 5 years, as long as you maintain it, about 15-20 years. Brittany asked about if we were still considering opening it up to the public for comment. Jeff said it was not open to public comment. Jeff said with he and Jason wanting to add ramps into the park to make it ADA compliant, because almost none of the other parks are ADA compliant, it limits what equipment can be used in the park. Nora said basically you can't modify it too much. Jason said when they met with the playground folks they were given 3 options so it's just not really possible. Tim asked about the fencing and the boulders around. Jeff said the fencing and walkways in the park will be changed but the boulders will stay, they act as a guardrail in case of a car crash. The monument will also stay. Jason said that was dedicated a long time ago. Nora said it was for Dr, Virginia Haggerty, a pediatrician. Tim also asked about the signage that says park closes at 10:00 pm is that a safety issue with the park not having lights. Jeff said they're looking at park signage now because some signs are outdated so they will be

updated. Jason said they should say dusk, except Harbor Island Park. No action the committee needs to take now, Jason said we will vote on it with the final price and everything we're going to do and then it will go to the Board for review.

Mamaroneck Avenue School PTSA Fund Raiser Fund Request

Per Jason, MAS wants to do a small fundraiser. It's a normal deck rental but they want to do alcohol, beer and wine only, so he wanted to bring it to us for our approval. The committee thought it was fine. Tina made a motion to approve the MAS fundraiser with alcohol, Tim seconded, all approved.

Florence Park Playground Damaged Rubber Surface Removal & Replacement UPDATE:

Jeff said they got the price for the rubber chips for the park, the amount would be somewhere around \$30,000 vs the wood chips which would be around \$4,000-\$4,500. He'd rather put that money into the playground equipment. Jason said the even the wood chips have gone through the roof. Tina asked if we have to replenish the rubber chips as often as the wood chips. Jeff said the wood chips break down, the rubber chips get kicked out of the playground and get lost. He's going to present it to the Board with just the wood chips.

Recreation Update:

Day Camp Update:

Jason said day camp is pretty full, we have 305 registered campers compared to 260 last year. Average group size about 36 kids. 92% of the camp is residents, demand is there, particularly for grades 3-6. It's good to know registration is set so he can work on planning which is the biggest thing; supplies, trips entertainers, etc., things go quick. The biggest struggle is getting camp counselors, minimum age is 16. Tina asked about scholarship kids. Jason said 9 kids are on scholarship, mostly from MAS, possibly a few from Rye Neck. Karrie asked about the breakdown of Mamaroneck vs Rye Neck kids because parents often ask. Jason said he doesn't have the exact number but the majority is Rye Neck kids.

Jason said they are working with the Arts Council on a couple different thing which he'll bring to us when they have definitive plans. Trying to do art-based movie and a few other pop-up concerts in the parks. Nora said there are a lot of events, 4 pop-up concerts on Fridays, maybe the poetry garden. The poetry garden is getting a new sculpture, a tortoise. Jason said beach/parking permits went on sale Monday so things are moving.

New Event Update - Spring Egg Hunt:

Jason said they partnered with EMS, PBA, VOMFD Ladies Aux Group to do an egg hunt on the beach. Free event is full at 160 kids. Activities, include egg hunt, bubble show, face painting, basket decorating, music, food trucks.

Parks Update: Jeff said they spread just over 30 yards of top soil in HI to fix the divots and holes. They seeded and fertilized their first field ever, in-house. Next field is the outfield of Lanza field. The community gardens are up and running. They replaced all the top soil that was damaged during Ida. They're doing garbage pick up, clean up, bench replacement, refurbishing some picnic table for HI, just a

lot of maintenance and upkeep. They seeded Croce Field, the outfield of Lanza field will be next. Tina asked about the Lanza field lights. Jason said everything has been provided to MUSCO but he thinks they have to wait until November so he doesn't have to cancel any sports. The lights take 6-8 weeks to come in once they're ordered and about 2 weeks to install.


County Pier and Paving at HI:

Jason also said Jerry wanted him to mention about the county pier that the county was waiting on the DEC but the county has to purchase some land on Taylor's Lane in order to start the project. Jeff said the county has to preserve a certain amount of land before they can start the county pier project. Jason said they're in contract with some estate near Taylor's Lane, 1.5 million piece of land, that will be preserved then the state will let them do that work. They're hoping everything goes well and they're breaking ground May 1st. Jeff said the county pulled the permit already so they should be close. Tina asked how it will affect parking in the Harbor and kids playing on the field. Jeff said the staging area is going to be on the side of his building and it will be all fenced so no one will be able to get in there and there will be enough room between the field and the fence so nothing else will be really affected, other than some construction noise which can't be helped. Tim asked if at some point the public will know. Jason said yes, this will be noticed. Nora said this was supposed to start previously but there's been hiccups. Once there's a real start date the Village will post and blast it out. What's happening before that is paving the parking lot. Jason said that will start April 18th. They're going to do it in stages and should be completed in mid-May. Morano Bros. will do the curb repair, milling and then paving.

Dog Park: Karrie asked Jeff if we heard back from HCZMC about the plans yet. He spoke to Dan a couple days after our last meeting and they are still waiting to hear back but it's on his list to discuss with Dan.

Closing: Tina asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting, Karrie made a motion, Heather seconded. Meeting adjourned.
